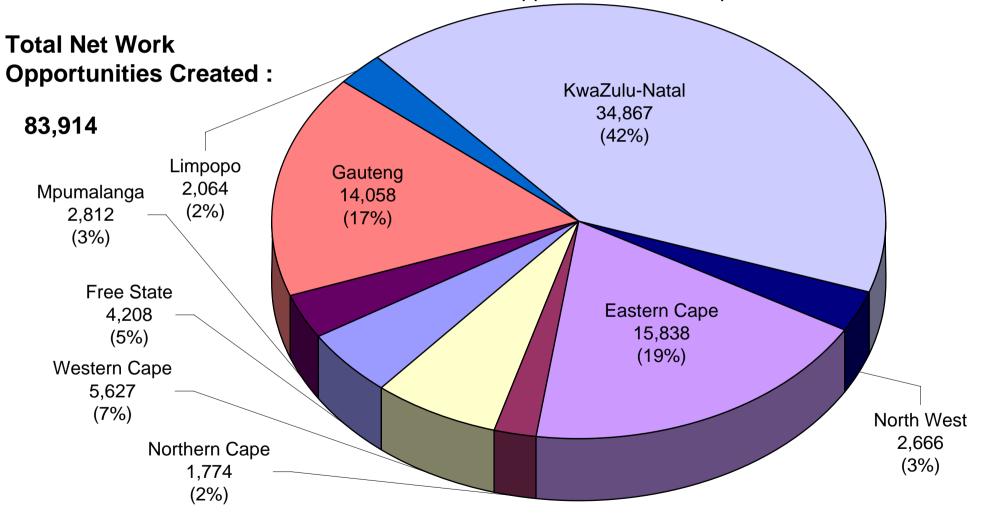

Overall National Total: Net Work Opportunities Created per Province





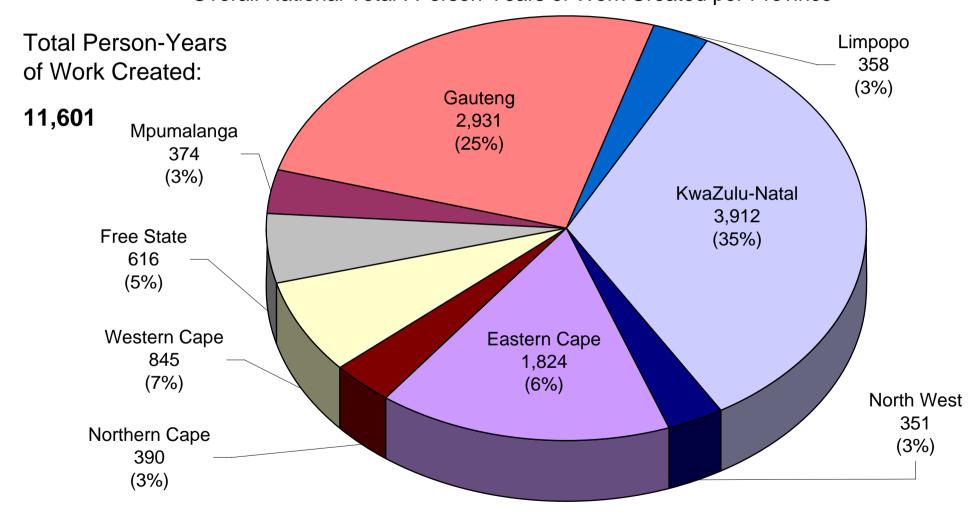
