

EPWP Project Launch, Port Elizabeth 28 July 2016

The ANC Manifesto in 2014 committed us to create 6 million work opportunities over the five years of this government.

At the time, the DA ridiculed the EPWP – as not being 'real jobs' – like the low paid farmworkers of the Western Cape. But today the DA municipalities are fully on board with this programme – and as government we are on track to deliver. In the first 2 years of EPWP Phase 3 we have created 1.8 million work opportunities.

The EPWP programme is critical – in the midst of a global economic crisis – when the private sector cannot create new jobs fast enough – as government we said – we have to act decisively.

The EPWP contributes massively in various ways:

- It provides financial support to the poorest of the poor particularly youth and women – and the pride that goes with doing an honest day's work;
- It provides training, skills and work-experience; and
- It improves services and facilities in poor communities cleaning up cemeteries, providing home-based health care to the sick, providing childcare support, building community halls, maintaining roads etc.
